

StrengtheningtheRegion: Report on CAR Virtual Meeting, 1/22/22

On Saturday, January 22, 2022, members of the Carolinas Region gathered via ZOOM to discuss some important issues facing our region and its chapters: how to engage current members, how to attract new members, and how to ensure the continued growth of EGA as an organization.

The meeting was very productive and was filled with information and suggestions. **We recorded the meeting in two parts. Part 1 covers the presentation made by Marge Kelly, the National EGA Vice President. She reviewed the demographic findings from the National EGA survey of members conducted last fall. Wendy Lynn, the EGA National Director of Membership and Marketing, also provided some helpful information during the question and answer session.

Part 2 focused on a discussion of what our CAR chapters can do to take the first step. After the group developed a list of marketing activities that might be useful, Carole Overton, our Region Director, charged each CAR chapter to select one marketing activity and carry it out before May 1. Then, at our CAR Board of Directors meeting this spring, each chapter will be asked to report on what they did and how it went. Chapters should take photos of the activity in progress and send them to the RD so that she can share them with everyone during our meeting.

Activities for your Chapters:

In the Part 2 video, you will see the list of activities that we came up with during the meeting. However, it is important to note that, although you may choose one of the activities listed below, you do not have to do so. Your chapter may come up with something else. Whatever you do, however, the idea is to try something different than what you have done in the past. This means that if, for example, you want to try the same type of activity you have done in the past, you should select a new location and try a different approach.

OnlineStitch-ins vs. Interest Groups: Is it Time for a Change?

During our meeting on January 22, we heard a suggestion from Wendy Lynn, the EGA National Director of Membership and Marketing. Wendy said that her Great Lakes Region (GLR) had recently started an online "affinity" group focused on surface embroidery, crewel, and goldwork. Stitchers who are interested in those types of techniques gather via ZOOM once a month. Wendy said this is not a chapter it is just a group of members with a common interest. Although there is often no agenda, a range of topics may be discussed. (She invited members of our region to join the group. If you are interested, contact Wendy for more information at marketing@egausa.org).

If any of you have joined the CAR twice-monthly region stitch-ins, this description may sound familiar. Our stitch-ins have not been focused on any particular technique but in the course of the session we also cover a lot of territory and rarely leave without learning something new.

Now that we are almost finished with our <u>second year</u> of monthly stitch-ins (can it really have been that long?), we are wondering if you are interested in trying something different. Would you be interested in attending a region-wide interest group via ZOOM? Some chapters have set up in-person interest groups so that people who like a particular technique can meet to work on their projects in that area. The online version would be similar.

The most familiar techniques seem to be counted, canvas, beading, goldwork, and mixed media, for example. Would you be interested in joining an online group in one of those areas? Do you want to suggest another area to consider? While we would love to set up such groups if there is interest, we would need someone to volunteer to serve as the leader/host. If you are interested in joining or leading, or have any questions about this option, send your comments to regiondirector@egacarolinas.org.

In the meantime, until we see what our members would prefer, we will continue to hold our monthly stitch-ins where anyone and everyone is welcome, no matter what you are working (or not working) on. CARChapterHappenings Golden Needles, a hit at Quilting & Fiber Art Extravaganza!

Golden Needles members had a wonderful time recruiting new members at the *Statesville Quilting and Fiber Art Extravaganza* on Friday, January 28. This annual vendor show for quilters takes place on the last weekend in January on Friday and Saturday. It's hosted by Quilter's Gallery

(www.quiltersgallery.net), an online quilt shop. When we mentioned to the Quilter's Gallery that we were a non-profit organization, they graciously offered us a free booth!

We received a total of 33 contact forms from the visitors:

- 23 for Golden Needles (Concord, NC)
- 4 for Piedmont (Greensboro, NC)
- 4 for Charlotte
- 1 for Cardinal (Raleigh, NC)
- 1 for the Laurel (Hendersonville, NC)

Our volunteer team included Patty Schmid (co-organizer), Evelyn Southards (our president), Joyce Baker (a new member who found us through the Raleigh Quilt Expo), Marilynn Helms, Gail Hicks, Cindy Jones (our secretary), and Mitzi Malcolm. Thank you volunteers!

About 230 people attended the show. We set up our booth at 7:30 a.m. on Friday. Carole Overton, our Region Director, loaned us the CAR festival kit. Details about this won-



derful kit are available from Carole (email: regiondirec-

tor@egacarolinas.org). Visitors to our booth were very interested in the smalls in the large clear container from the kit (see photos). We used the metal display shelf to show some embroidery and added a bulletin board of our own. A mannequin loaned by Patty Schmid displayed a shirt that had surface embroidery. We felt it was important to display examples of both surface embroidery and counted thread embroidery and to show designs that required a full range of ability, including beginner-level pieces. The laminated maps in the CAR festival kit were helpful to determine what chapter was nearest for each visitor.

Our Approach to Visitors

Our goals were to introduce visitors to EGA and convince them to complete our contact form. Our approach was to ask, "Do you do any hand stitching?" If they answered "yes" or looked interested in our displays, we said, "We are the Embroiderers' Guild of America and we specialize in hand stitching of all kinds." Then, we asked if they liked surface embroidery or counted type work such as counted cross stitch. We gave them the brochure from EGA National and our chapter's flyer. If they seemed ready, we asked for their contact information. When they completed the form, we gave them our free gifts (see below).

If they seemed doubtful or needed more information, we showed them our chapter's program plan for the year, including photos of some examples and also the current Education Catalog from EGA that includes correspondence courses, online offerings, and more.



Not everyone needed all of this information to become comfortable giving us their contact information. We learned to stop talking and let them complete the contact form as soon as they seemed comfortable

doing that. In the context of a quilt show, many people are only interested in machine stitching. We let those move past the booth with a smile and focused our efforts on the hand stitchers.

Handouts

Our handouts included our chapter's one-page flyer and the EGA National tri-fold brochure. Those who gave us their contact information received free charts, fabric, and DMC stranded cotton. Gail Smith, our Assistant Region Director (email: asstregiondirector@egacarolinas.org), loaned us a large notebook filled with page protectors that contained donated free charts, DMC, and aida cloth to cut. In addition, we photocopied two Valentinerelated designs, placed them in page protectors and added the DMC and fabric.

Costs

The printing for the contact forms, giveaway charts, and our flyers was about \$40. The brochures from EGA National were free. We ordered them from Tonya Parks (email: typarks@egausa.org) at headquarters. Each volunteer paid \$5 admission and will be reimbursed. There was no charge for parking. Mileage can be reimbursed at the \$.14 per mile IRS rate for volunteers upon request. Some of this cost can be reimbursed by National or the region. At a previous meeting, our chapter voted to cover any additional costs for this quilt show.

Lessons Learned

Our free booth was size 6x6 and had no pipe and drape, so we were not able to hang the large Carolinas Region banner. Regular vendor booths were \$390 and size 10 x 14. We decided it might be worth paying for pipe and drape next year so we could display the large CAR banner. Another option is to make a smaller, lightweight banner for our chapter.



We were offered the booth only for Friday. At the end of the show, the organizer said that we could have it for Saturday, too, but we had not recruited volunteers and snow was due on Friday night. Next year, we will consider planning for both days.

Follow Up

The next day, we emailed the twenty-three contacts for our chapter and invited them to our meeting on Tuesday, February 1. The email included information about EGA National, our region, and our chapter with the chapter flyer and program schedule attached. We also attached a photo of our chapter having fun at our Halloween party. We will send each contact an email reminder inviting them to our meetings for the next several months. Marketing research shows that people often need to see the information several times to respond. We will follow up with a phone call to each contact – some people respond well to phone contact, but ignore emails.

We will pass contact information for the other ten contacts to the appropriate chapters. We are happy to answer questions about the process or provide copies of our forms and the emails sent to visitors for other chapters to use as templates. We hope that other chapters will join us in spreading the word about EGA and recruiting new members.

Golden Needles members had a great time meeting other embroiderers. We especially enjoyed seeing the delight when they saw our embroidery and spoke to us with the enthusiasm that shows they are already members of our hand embroidery tribe. It is a pure joy to welcome them to EGA.

*Emergency*LocatorForm:

Do you know where your chapter's assets are?

Over the years, your chapters have accumulated an assortment of assets, both electronic records and physical materials. It is important to keep track of where all of these materials are stored so that they may be located when needed.

It is especially important to know exactly where things are in case of emergency if the officer responsible for the items is suddenly unable to continue in her/his role. Will someone else be able to get those items in order to continue to conduct the chapter's business?

Sadly, in recent years EGA has heard of several very important examples of the need to keep track of files. (Specifics are purposely omitted.) For example, in one instance a website was in the control of only one person; when that person became incapacitated, no one else knew the administrator passwords so the website could no longer be updated. The group in question had to build a new website from scratch. Imagine what difficulties your chapter might face if the person who has the chapter's records was unable to fulfill her/his role. Would someone else be able to easily locate and access those records? Would someone know exactly what items belong to the chapter and be able to collect them?

We hate to consider these situations but it is important to be prepared for all eventualities. Therefore, we are asking all of our chapters to take some time to fill out a "Document/Files Emergency Location Form." Here is the link to the form on the EGA National website: (https://egausa.org/app/uploads/2018/12/ Anc 1.5.1.7-Document-Files-Emergency-Location-Form.pdf). You must log in to the website before you can access the form. If you cannot use the link, look under Policies and Procedures: Ancillary Documents. It is designated as Ancillary Document 1.5.1.7.

Remember that you need to consider all of your forms, documents, and assets, whether electronic or physical in nature.

Work with your chapter members to fill out this form. Feel free to add pages as needed. Designate where this form will be stored. For example, should your chapter president and secretary keep copies in their files? Should each of your chapter officers have a copy? Then make sure the form is always kept up-to-date. Remember to update locations and pass the forms along when your officers change.

It may take a little time to record all of this information the first time around, but it will be well worth it should your chapter ever find itself in the type of difficult situation described earlier in this article. Let's follow the Boy Scout motto: Be prepared!
