During this three-day event, you can sign-up for a tour of the Museum of Early Southern Decorative Arts in near-by Winston-Salem; visit the *Time to Stitch* needlework shop, also in Winston-Salem; register for a wonderful class (see below); and enjoy the fellowship of mingling and stitching with new and old friends. And, of course, everyone is invited to attend the Region's Board of Directors Annual meeting – hear what the Region and National EGA is doing and what is planned for the future.

Those who attended the 2022 Fall Retreat were able to view these class pieces offered at next June's Seminar.



**Dawn Donnelly** will teach *Sea Treasures*, an intermediate-level 18-ct canvas or linen piece (your choice of material) that incorporates actual sea shells (either provided in the kit or provided from your own personal collection).

Mary Alice Sinton will teach Whirligig Treasure Chest, a basic Japanese Beading technique in which you attach beads onto a printed fabric, and then finish by mounting it into a Sudberry trinket box (included in the kit).



And **Pat Olski** will teach *Blush Peony Pin, Necklace, and Bracelet* set, using embellished Dorset Buttons. Pat's class, suitable for all levels, teaches the basics of how to wrap and embellish Dorset Buttons and then incorporate them into different pieces of jewelry.



Watch for a teaser brochure to come out first, then we will send out the full brochure to include registration forms and everything else you need to join in the fun. Registration begins immediately after the holidays, with Early Registration starting January 2, 2023.


FRIDAY NIGHT LECTURE: "Exploring Shading in Surface Embroidery" by Kim Sanders

Quorum: There being more than one-third of the delegates present (22 of 37), a quorum was declared.

Minutes: Minutes from the Spring Virtual Meeting on May 22, 2022, were approved as previously emailed.

Treasurer's Report: Elizabeth Little (treasurer@egacarolinas.org)

Statements for the operating account and seminar account were previously emailed. There were no questions. A proposed budget was distributed. There was no discussion on the proposed budget. Budget was passed unanimously.

## Education Coordinator Report: Janice Wright (education @egacarolinas.org)

Janice Wright reported that there were 22 participants in the seminar class. With Kim Sanders not able to attend this retreat, Roberta Smith graciously took charge and helped teach the class and it was a success. The lecture scheduled for Friday night was presided over by Carole Overton with a power point presentation. It was a successful and informational lecture. The ITT Class with Jane Nichols is scheduled to begin Monday, September 5<sup>th</sup>. Seventeen people have signed up. Ms. Nichols has a website where all her classes are listed. She is also scheduled to have a class at the National Convention in Boston in 2023. Everyone in attendance was reminded about the CRESS Award for 2023 and the Roxie Hodgkin Scholarship for upcoming seminars.

Janet Noble (nominee for CAR Director of Education) reported on the 2023 retreat in Clemmons, NC. Dates are 6/1-6/4 2023. Three classes will be offered, and a preview of the class projects was provided for view. A fall retreat is in the planning stage. A committee will look into other possible venues for a retreat. Pinehurst, NC, is under consideration. Suggestions for other locations are being accepted. In 2024, the National Seminar will be in Atlanta.

Christine Haimann raised a concern about the seminar in Clemmons. The facility does not have an elevator. The committee will consider this and possibly reserve rooms on the ground floor.

Everyone present was asked to refocus outreach efforts. Reports need to be in by January 15.

Seminar Director's Report: Christine Haimann (seminardirector@egacarolinas.org)

There was further discussion of the seminar in Clemmons. The facility gave us a Hospitality Room for snacks and drinks. Volunteers are needed to staff this room. It was also discussed that there might be a "Stash Reallocation" table provided. All this will be discussed at a later date. The Laurel Chapter has agreed to head this up.

Congratulations to Kim Sanders for winning the 2022 National Gold Thread Award, presented to her at the National Seminar in NYC. We now have two national Gold Thread Winners from the Carolinas Region!!

Social Media accounts are on the rise. Need to make sure there is more than one administrator for each account. Reminder to use the new (updated) EGA logo when making new chapter name badges and correspondence. Get approval on all things relating to the logo.

There was a discussion on compensation to region rep. Compensation will be offered, but they can refuse the compensation or donate it to their chapter.

The National Lecture Series is changing to a Webinar format. This will allow up to 500 people to attend. There is a charge of \$5 per lecture. This will all be explained in the *Needlearts* Newsletter. These can be used for a chapter program, but everyone in attendance needs to pay the \$5.

Through the Needles Eye (TNE), formerly a travelling exhibit, will be a virtual experience. Carole showed a teaser film about how it will look. It will be great. When completed, EGA will own the film. Look for it on the website under TNE.

The progress of a new chapter forming was reported on. As a result of activities at the Raleigh Quilt Expo in 2021, some people were interested in joining, but did not have a local chapter. Some of these people lived in the Pinehurst area. Marguerite Ewing and Julia Tison of the Florence Area Chapter decided to look into it. (Marguerite is from the area). Contact was made with a local needlepoint shop and they went to work. Our first meeting in July was an introductory open house. We made kits to give out and provided information on the chapter.
